For information of Little Rock, the IVES-HENRY file was reviewed from June, 1988, through August, 1988, with what the writer feels are the following significant portions:

What is very interesting regarding this report is that [REDACTED] on the advice of his attorney, would not make a statement to [REDACTED] Arkansas State Police, on July 5, 1988. [REDACTED] Saline County, reported to [REDACTED] on August 12, 1988. [REDACTED] advised that [REDACTED] told him that KEVIN IVES had been beaten very badly by a phone booth before being laid on the tracks.

This statement is extremely peculiar since [REDACTED] would not make a statement earlier. It appears that this statement was in furtherance of conspiracy to spread rumors.
