In addition to these polygraphs, the letter noted evidence had been submitted to the FBI Laboratory for analyses. The FBI Laboratory has advised the body fluids found on the clothing of the victims had degraded to the point DNA analysis is impossible. Further, human hairs found on the clothing and a latent print found on the scope of the rifle located at the scene were compared with negative results with hair samples and fingerprints obtained by subpoena from five individuals. No hair samples or fingerprints from the victims were available for comparison purposes.

Finally, a lead resulting from the "Unsolved Mysteries" television show was developed. A lead was forwarded to Conyers, Georgia, but that investigation failed to develop any pertinent information relating to this matter.

As you recall, it was earlier alleged that supplied cocaine to minors. There were also allegations of a conspiracy to commit murders, as a result of possible offenses charged under Title 21. In December, 1993, First Assistant United States Attorney Michael Johnson advised if the allegations were corroborated, then federal jurisdiction may exist. In the ensuing twenty-eight months since that decision, extensive investigation has failed to support those allegations.

but steadfastly denied any involvement in the deaths, the results of the polygraph notwithstanding. It is noted that was one of the five individuals whose hair samples and fingerprints were submitted to the FBI Laboratory for comparison as described above, with negative results.

While there are indications of misconduct within the Saline County criminal justice system, these have not developed into offenses that warrant further federal investigation into the deaths of Ives and Henry. Your office, along with the FBI, is aggressively pursuing an investigation in Saline County involving the criminal justice system.

Based on the foregoing, it is my recommendation that the FBI conduct no further investigation into this matter.

### FBI hasn't ruled out train death's probe

By JERRY BREEDEN Courier Staff Writer

An FBI investigation into the deaths nine years ago of two Saline County teen-age boys hasn't been officially ruled out, according to the state's leading FBI agent.

I.C. Smith told The Benton Courier on Tuesday he takes exception with certain statements made recently about the FBI's involvement by Jean Duffey, a former 7th Judicial District assistant prosecutor and one-time administrator of the district's now-disbanded drug task force.

Smith is chief of all FBI agents in Arkansas.

He said he believes Duffey was mistaken when she said in a recent Little Rock radio station interview that the Bureau participated in a coverup of the Aug. 23, 1987, deaths of Kevin Ives, then 17, and Don Henry, then 16.

Their bodies were found on the railroad tracks near the Shobe Road Crossing, where the youths allegedly had been run over by a Union Pacific train.

During the interview, Duffey — speaking by phone from the Houston, Texas, area — also said that Special Agent Bill Temple last Nov. 29 told Ives' mother, Linda Ives of Benton, that:

"In light of the fact that there is no evidence of anything, it is time you consider the fact that a crime was never committed"

Smith said Temple is "a caring individual" who "has been very concerned, because he has been so badly misquoted."

Smith said the meeting between Temple and Linda Ives took place in Smith's office. Smith said he was not there at the time, but that he is convinced Temple said nothing to Ives in such a "cold-hearted" manner.

Circumstances surrounding the deaths were examined during a public prosecutor's hearing and a grand jury probe that lasted eight months.

Seventh Judicial District Prosecuting Attorney Dan Harmon, as special deputy prosecutor at the time, spearheaded those inquiries.

The grand jury rejected a ruling by then-state medical examiner Dr. Fahmy Malak, who said the deaths were acci-

dental.

Jurors based their findings on second autopsies performed by a Georgia forensic pathologist.

His findings were that Henry had suffered a stab wound in the back, and that Ives had been subjected to a facial beating before they were struck by the train.

Smith said there still remains "some doubt as to the causes of death" and that both he and Temple "have great empathy for the families" of the two boys.

He also said cases such as the Ives-Henry deaths are an investigator's nightmare. "They are terribly frustrating," Smith said, "because we can't put an end to them."

Smith noted that the FBI's main obstacle is "the very real problem of determining whether federal jurisdiction would apply."

That question, he said, would have to be decided by U.S. Attorney Paula Casey's office.

While she said she "can't' comment on any particular case," Casey told The Benton Courier that her office "always works very closely with the FBI."

Any decision would likely be the outcome of a joint investigation by both the FBI and U.S. Attorney's office.

Rumors were rampant at the time of the deaths. One was that the boys were killed because they stumbled upon "some drug runners" in action, Smith said.

He also said that the drugrunners scenario was widely talked about by one lawman in particular. He, according to Smith, only perpetuated the rumor and did nothing official to get at the truth.

"If any lawman has knowledge of a crime, especially one as serious as murder, he is being negligent of his duties not to pursue it in an official, professional manner," Smith said.

While speculation about the boys' deaths has been rampant, the investigation appears to be stuck on high-center.

Or is it?

"I will say this," Smith noted. "There may be some foul play involved in the deaths of those boys, and I would be will See TRAIN, page 7

ing to meet personally with Mrs. Ives and discuss the case."

In the meantime, Smith said, the FBI's forensic laboratory in Washington, D.C., still has in its possession certain evidence connected with the case.

It will be kept there in storage until a legal decision is reached on how the matter is to be pursued.

Smith was adamant about not wanting to give the families of the youths cause for building on false hopes.

Unless and until an official declaration of the causes of death can be made, the matter will continue to be subject to conjecture.

Even if the deaths are shown to be homicides, he said, that — in and of itself — would not mean that federal intervention is warranted.

Dear Ms. Casey:

The purpose of this letter is to provide the United States Attorney's Office with an overview of theories in this matter as requested.

On May 26, 1988, Circuit Judge John W. Cole wrote a letter to then Special Agent in Charge (SAC) Don K. Pettus requesting that the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI) conduct an investigation into the deaths of Kevin Ives and Don Henry.

On June 2, 1988, SAC Pettus responded to Judge John Cole. SAC Pettus advised that the Arkansas State Police (ASP) was conducting the investigation into the Ives-Henry deaths and that, under pertinent authorizing statutes, the FBI is allowed to cooperate and offer the full forensic services of the FBI Laboratory and the FBI Identification Division in Washington, D. C. SAC Pettus advised Judge Cole that information should continue to be furnished to the ASP who would then direct information and requests to the FBI.

On June 13, 1988, Major Doug Stevens, ASP, requested assistance in taking acoustical/decibel measurements on the railroad track concerning the deaths of Henry and Ives.

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Based on Major Stevens' request, FBI Headquarters, Engineering Section, was contacted. Engineering Section would perform the requested tests.

On January 4, 1989, the FBI Laboratory furnished the results of the decibel test conducted regarding the noise of an oncoming train. These results were furnished to ASP. In addition, all information in the FBI file pertaining to this matter, which was obtained from May 26, 1988, to December 18, 1993, was also furnished to ASP.

On December 18, 1993, Supervisory Special Agent (SSA) opened the Ives-Henry case based on a review of information contained in the file from May 26, 1988, to December 18, 1993. The following reasons were cited for opening this investigation:

(1) On December 16, 1993, Saline County Sheriff Judy Pridgen personally appeared at the Little Rock FBI Office and requested an FBI investigation into this matter

(3) In a newspaper article dated June 15, 1990, in the "Arkansas Democrat Gazette," James Davis Callaway was reported as being implicated in the victims' deaths. According to the article, Paul William Criswell, a former employee of Callaway's, was charged with possession of a controlled substance during 1990. Criswell had told his girlfriend that Henry and Ives were trying to steal cocaine from Callaway's home and were caught in the act and killed.

Based on the foregoing and the fact that CW passed a Saline County Sheriff's Office polygraph on most of his first statement, this matter was discussed with First Assistant United States Attorney (AUSA) Michael Johnson on December 16, 1993; December 17, 1993; and December 18, 1993. AUSA Johnson advised that the allegations relating to the purview of Title 21, U.S.



Code, Section 859, and that conspiracy to commit a murder as a result of offenses charged under Title 21 are Federal violations and would be prosecuted if corroborated. To date, these allegations have not been corroborated.

Additional theories outlined below have been provided to the FBI by various sources:

- (1) Don Henry and Kevin Ives were in a marijuana-induced sleep when they were passed over by a Union-Pacific train.
- (2) Don Henry and Kevin Ives accidentally came upon a methamphetamine laboratory where they saw law enforcement individuals. Henry and Ives were to be intimidated and taught a lesson when one boy was accidentally killed, and, therefore, the other boy was killed as well.
- (3) Don Henry and Kevin Ives were going to rip off drugs from a location near Don Henry's home. The boys were caught in the act and killed.

In January 1994, the Little Rock Division took receipt of the only remaining evidence from the Ives-Henry case from Saline County. The evidence in this case consisted of:

Two (2) pairs of jeans

Two (2) pairs of underwear

Two (2) pairs of tennis shoes Two (2) shirts

One (1) .22 rifle with a scope

The FBI Laboratory examined this evidence and determined the following:

Located on the clothing are:

Caucasian hairs; Sperm located in the underwear of Don Henry; Fingerprints located on the scope lens of the gun

The following individuals were subpoenaed for samples of blood, hair, and fingerprints for comparison with evidence found on the boys' clothing based on allegations of their involvement in the deaths:

The FBI Laboratory advised that latent fingerprints did not match the fingerprints submitted for these individuals. The other requested tests have not yet been completed.

### Linda Ives responds

### to FBI interview

The mother of one of two Bryant teen age boys who died under mysterious circumstances nine years ago, says "the FBI is participating in a coverup" of the controversial case.

Linda Ives, whose son, Kevin Ives, then 17, and his friend, Don Henry, then 16, made that allegation — and others—in response to a story in The Benton Courier Wednesday.

Ives takes exception to several statements by I.C. Smith, special agent in charge of the FBI in Arkansas.

One of those statements was that the Bureau has not abandoned the investigation into the controversial case.

Ives and others are convinced the boys were murdered before their bodies were placed on a railroad track hear Alexander and run over by a locomotive on Aug. 23, 1987.

A grand jury that examined the evidence over an eight-month period ruled that the boys were murdered.

She also said when Brown requested assistance from the FBI, they "instructed Brown to turn over all of the evidence in the case" to the Bureau, which he did Judy Pridgen (Saline County sheriff) pulled John Brown off the case and he resigned, from the sheriff's office.

....The only persons who, now appear negligent in their duties is the FBL 7. Ives said.

Ives said when she asked for a meeting with the FBI last November, "my initial request was to meet with Smith, but it was told it should be with his assistant, Temple.

"I would welcome the opportunity to meet with Smith, she added.

Smith said in his interview that he would be willing to meet and discuss the case with

Ives During the November meet ing, Temple said a summary. of the case with a request for advice was sent to Paula Casey's office in July 1995. Ives said.

How long does it take to get a response from the U.S. Attorney's office? Temple said he didn't know," Ives added.

She also said both Temple and Cournan told her "that when the file is closed," it could be obtained by filing a Freedom of Information request.

"I can only assume from that statement," Ives said, "that the FBI has no intention of pursuing the murderers of my child.
