Writer reviewed the portion of captioned file from January, 1988, through May, 1988. The following portions of the file are viewed as being significant: b7C

[REDACTED] in forensic pathology, #2 Village Square, P. O. Box 8440, Hot Springs Village, Arkansas, reviewed autopsy reports regarding captioned subjects. [REDACTED] provided the following evaluation:

Protocol and proper procedure were not handled correctly in examination of MEA-300-87, DON HENRY. Evidence and cause of death were listed in the middle of the protocol of MEA-301-87, KEVIN IVES, before examining the major portion of the body.

MEA-300-87 was shown clothed. MEA-301-87 was shown not clothed.

Upon examination and investigation, in neither case was the chest directly passed over by the train. The lungs themselves show massive contusion from trauma and segmental aspiration of blood, which is rather typical for cases in which blood is present in the airway during terminal breathing or gasping.

The possibility of strangulation in one case, MEA-301-87, cannot be ruled out due to the damage of the larynx.

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The conclusions of [REDACTED] report are as follows:

Neither the investigation nor the post mortem examinations were complete (covering on the bodies was never explained and the protocol on MEA-301-87 had many deletions). The boys were either alive at the time of the train impact or, if not alive, were dead for only a short while prior to impact.

As early as March 17, 1988, the families of the deceased requested that the evidence from the crime scene be submitted to the FBI Laboratory for analysis. In a letter dated March 17, 1988, to [REDACTED] from [REDACTED] [REDACTED] Arkansas State Police, indications were made as to whether evidence should be submitted to another laboratory rather than to the FBI.

A [REDACTED] white male, date of birth [REDACTED] advised that [REDACTED] DON HENRY. [REDACTED] further reported that [REDACTED], who was not only a heavy user but also a dealer.

In this section of the file appear the results of the second autopsy. In this autopsy is noted a specific pattern mark on the left side of the face of KEVIN IVES. Consistent with this pattern mark is a fracture which radiates through the mandible into the tempo-mandibular joint.

Pertaining to DON HENRY, it is verified that the larynx has been crushed as well as incision wounds to the back.

Both of these findings are pertinent enough to render the boys helpless on the tracks prior to being run over by a train. When all events occurring are taken into account, the logical conclusion is that the deaths of KEVIN IVES and DON HENRY were the result of foul play.

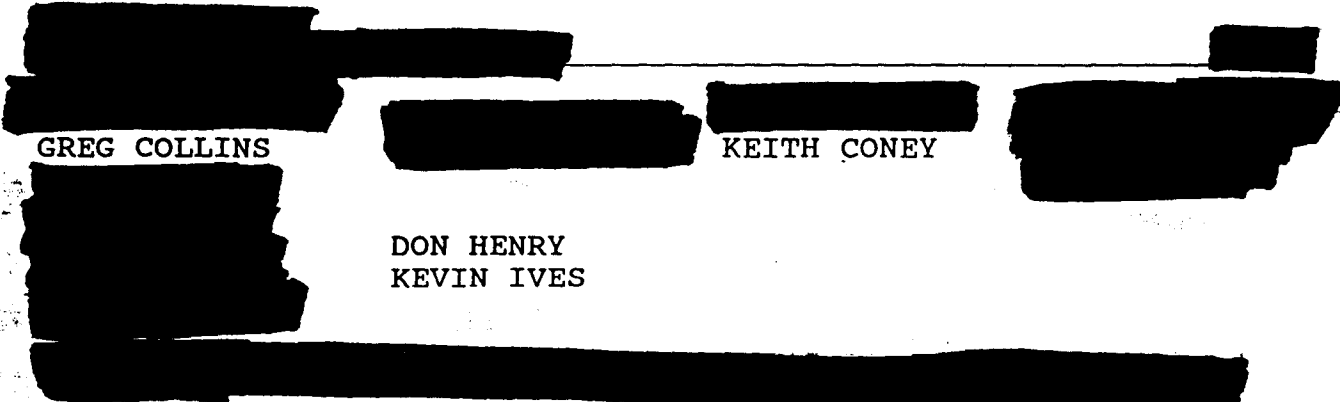
On May 26, 1988, [redacted] with Arkansas State Police, contacted [redacted] was asking [redacted] about a report regarding the HENRY-IVES case. [redacted] advised [redacted] that a thirty-page report was left with the prosecuting attorney's office in Saline County. [redacted] advised [redacted] that the findings of the IVES-HENRY case were probable homicide which gives the Arkansas State Police authority. [redacted] further related that individuals in Saline County, specifically [redacted], would not turn over any reports to the Arkansas State Police.

Also involved in the Saline County criminal enterprise is an individual by the name of [redacted] GREG COLLINS (deceased), [redacted] were involved in numerous WAL-MART robberies in Tennessee, Louisiana, and Texas which netted well over \$100,000. [redacted] in the murder of GREG COLLINS. The reason COLLINS was killed was because he talked too much. KEITH CONEY was also involved with robberies [redacted] It is speculated that CONEY was also with DON HENRY and KEVIN IVES on the hours of the incident of August 23, 1987.

KEITH CONEY, while delivering stolen trucks [redacted] was killed in a traffic accident. CONEY, while riding a motorcycle, was struck by an 18-wheeler which quickly left the scene. State Police investigators believe that this wreck was a setup.
